CALL TO ORDER AND FLAG SALUTE

## APPROVAL OF MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING OF JUNE 16, 1993

Upon the motion of Director Small and seconded by Director Mendoza, the minutes of the June 16, 1993 Regular Meeting was unanimously approved.

## BOARD ADMINISTRATION

 SUMMIT STATION, ANNEXATION NO. 6, PROTEST HEARING RESULTS

The results of the protest are as follows:

The Government Code states that an Annexation may proceed without an election if written protests have been filed and not withdrawn by less than 25 percent of the registered voters or less than 25 percent of the number of owners of land owning less than 25 percent of the assessed value of land within the proposed annexation.

The protests received by registered voters is below the 25% level and although the number of land owners protesting is greater than 25%, their assessed value of their land is less than 25% of the total assessed value.

Mr. Shaw read Resolution No. 482 approving annexation No. 6 (Summit Station). Upon the motion of Director Fairbanks and seconded by Director Mendoza, Resolution 482 was approved with Director Small as a dissenting vote.

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3. ADDITIONAL PROPERTY TAX SHIFT
On June 14, 1993 notification came from SLO County
to pay an additional five percent in property
taxes for the fiscal year end 6/30/93.
Originally, 35% or \$68,995 was scheduled to be
shifted. The State is now telling us to shift 5%
more, or in our case \$9,857. The County Auditors
Office has already withheld \$3,502.69 from our tax
revenues and is asking us to remit the balance of
\$6,354.31 in this fiscal year rather than
withholding it from future tax revenues. Their
reason is to get all of this year's tax shift
monies posted to this fiscal year so their records
are kept straight.

Upon the motion of Director Small and seconded by Director Fairbanks, the Board approved directing staff to write a letter of protest to SLO County regarding payment of additional 5%.
