FIRST WEEK (January 29 – February 5, 2008)

Water leak on Dana St. was repaired without incident.

- Blacklake WWTP Pond liner is pulling away from the wall. Contractor notified, pond isolated and the water is being pumped out. To be repaired on warranty.
- Noncompliance issues with DHS
 - Notified that distribution samples were not collected the first week of Jan. 2008
 - Letter of correction from May 2007 inspection by DHS had not been completed or mailed out. This situation has been addressed, and the response to DHS is being resolved.
 - Quarterly Raw Well water samples weren't collected in Jan.2008
 - When sampled in Feb. 2008, two of the wells had positive coliform results.

Responses to the letter of correction have been made, and corrective measures are in place to insure that sampling will be completed when scheduled. The wells that had positive coliform results had been offline for a period of time. One had a plugged chlorine injection line which has been temporarily repaired. The wells have been properly chlorinated and flushed. The staff has been notified of proper flushing and sampling techniques.

- 4. Pumping of pond at Southland WWTP- in progress.
- 5. Water Quality problems with BODs at Southland WWTP. Per the District Engineer's Feb. 13, 2008 report to the board, we assume that it was caused by redirecting the flow of the ponds in preparation of pumping down the pond #3. Staff has started keeping a log of activities at the plant. Timers are being used to start the composite samplers in the early hours, so that the samples are "fresh".
- Woodgreen Lift Station had a pump replaced temporarily. Both pumps are to be replaced. One is on order- due this month.

· Grant funding update

 Continue to learn the Department of Water Resources' grant process and its online grant filing program.

California Urban Water Conservation Council Update

- A plenary meeting will be held on March 12, 2008 in San Diego at which time final application approval vote by the Council membership will occur. The District will then receive our password for access to the CUWCC website's membersonly sections, which include the One-Stop-Grant section and research/reference section.
- A survey was distributed statewide in 2007 to assess the status of water shortage throughout the state, agencies' interest in assistance with drought preparation, and other issues. The survey's respondents demonstrated:
 - 71%: Taking extra steps to reduce water use throughout much of California in 2007.
 - 72%: Looking for information and assistance in helping customers reduce demand.
 - 68%: Interested in applying for financial assistance to support supply augmentation and demand reduction programs
 - Many were concerned about Delta pumping restrictions, inadequate billing systems, staffing, funding, and presenting a consistent message to the public.
- Assembly Bill 715: passed and chaptered. Requires that by the year 2014 all toilets offered for sale in California be high-efficiency models (1.2-gallons or less per flush; includes dual-flush models). A graduated ramp up (50% by 2010, 67% by 2011, etc.) is required to the 2014 100% target date.
- Federal Department of Energy denied the petition of the California Energy Commission to allow more stringent energy-efficiency clothes-washer standards for California. The CEC is considering an appeal.

- EPA "WaterSense" labeling for testing certification programs of landscape irrigation professionals. Certification requires those doing the testing and certification to test experienced professionals and provide program oversight in order to accurately assess their competency in designing, installing/maintaining and auditing water-efficient landscape irrigation systems.
- EPA "WaterSense" labeling program for products. Will educate American consumers on making smart water choices that save money and maintain high environmental standards without compromising performance.

Public education and outreach

- o Workshops, development of new public education materials
- o Letters to new customers
- Website updates

District landscape refurbishment update

- o Major refurbishment on hold until April groundwater assessment.
- District office's composting center has been installed. Worms are doing well and seem to love mashed potatoes.

District office tree removal

INFORMATION ON LANDSCAPE CONTRACTORS AND IRRIGATION EFFICIENCY

Background. Many District customers are willing to conserve water, but the landscape maintenance companies they use do not appear to be willing or able to aggressively manage the irrigation and the landscape to achieve water efficiency. The Board instructed staff to research the requirements for becoming a landscape contractor, and search for certifications or trainings which produce contractors who are able to efficiently manage the irrigation of a client's landscape.

California Landscape Contractors Association. The CLCA ((www.clca.org)) was incorporated as a non-profit entity in 1952, and currently has 17 regional chapters. The chapter for our area is the San Luis Obispo Chapter.

To become a Licensed Landscape Contractor, applicants are required to:

- Have four years experience in the landscape trade before testing. Credit for part of the four-year requirement may be given for education, technical training, or apprenticeship training.
- Pass the test. Application to test is \$250. There are license schools that can help the applicant in
 preparing for the test. The tests are given regularly throughout the state. If an applicant does not
 pass the first time, they can take the test as many times as they want for 18 months from the date
 of application to test before they have to file a new application.
- Other. License fees are \$150/year. Contractors are required to have a license bond, which is about \$100/year.

To join the CLCA, an applicant must be a Licensed Landscape Contractor, fill out the forms, and pay the dues.

CLCA Water Management Certification Program. The CLCA offers a Water Management Certification Program (WMCP) to landscape contractors and others, including consultants, architects and policymakers. The California Urban Water Conservation Council supports this program.

The program was initiated because of rising water rates and fines for run-off which have provided pocketbook incentive to residential and nonresidential landscape owners and managers to increase the efficiency of their irrigation practices. There was a rising need for landscape contractors trained to achieve and maintain maximum irrigation efficiency.

The program was started in 2007. The goal was to have a practical, profitable solution to the increased need for water efficiency in the landscape by training landscape contractors and other green industry professionals to provide their customers with good-to-excellent landscape appearance, using water based on actual plant requirements.

There are two levels of certification:

- 1. <u>Full Certification, "CLCA Water Manager."</u> Requires passing the certification test and maintenance of at least one property for one year at or below the landscape water budget as set by the CLCA Water Management Performance Program (100% of ETo).
- 2. <u>Expert Certification, "CLCA Expert Water Manager."</u> Requires passing the certification test and maintenance of at least five properties for one year, and continue to manage five properties at or below the water budget. The budget may not be more than 80% of ETo.

There are three parts to the certification process:

- 1. Passing the certification test. This provides the certificate holder with a "Provisional Certification."
- 2. Completion of the performance part of the process. This provides the certificate holder with a "Full Certification" as CLCA Water Manager.
- Maintenance of certification status.

For part 2 and part 3 of the process, the certificate holder submits to the CLCA the sites the certificate holder is managing. The CLCA WMCP then analyzes each site and prepares a water budget for each site. Verification of maintenance of water budget for performance certification, and maintenance of certification, is accomplished by the certificate holder (on a monthly basis) demonstrating water management results by submitting documentation (meter readings or water use billing statements) on each of the sites being managed. The CLCA then, on a monthly basis, sends a monthly report to each certificate holder outlining the percentage of the water budget used that month. These reports can then be submitted to customers as proof of the water savings.

The CLCA website has a list of companies employing Certified Water Managers, and a list of individual Certified Water Managers. Review of the current lists shows that there are no companies that employ Full Certified Water Managers in San Luis Obispo County listed. There are six companies that employ Provisional Certified Water Managers:

- Earthscapes (San Luis Obispo)
- Ewing Irrigation (San Luis Obispo)
- Garden Escapes (San Luis Obispo)
- J.K. Tubb Landscape and Design, Inc. (Paso Robles)
- K.D. Janni Landscaping (San Luis Obispo)
- Sprinkler King (San Luis Obispo)

There are no listings for companies Certified Water Managers in Santa Barbara County.

On the website there is a list for individual Certified Water Managers, but the locations for these individuals are not given.

Dear Bruce,

The franchise agreement between South County Sanitary Service and Nipomo CSD expires in June of 2008. Given that lawyers are involved, we need to get started. There are two significant changes coming that will effect our new agreement.

The first one is the Cold Canyon Landfill expansion. We are down to roughly two and half year's worth of capacity. The expansion project has been filed with the County of San Luis Obispo and the EIR is being prepared. The expansion will provide 30 years of future disposal capacity, an elevated C&D recycling line and an improved public recycling area. We are estimating it will require us to spend a minimum of \$9,000,000 plus county required mitigations. As before, Cold Canyon must borrow the funds and the Bank of America wants proof they will be paid back. They want to see long-term franchises from Cold Canyon's customers so the tonnage is committed.

The second change is the Air Pollution Control District's push to reduce emissions. Our changeover to CNG garbage trucks should provide a large part of the reductions that APCD will set as the goal for Nipomo CSD. We have started this replacement project. However, given the number of remaining diesel trucks and the cost of a CNG truck it will take many years.

The biggest concern for a garbage company is recovering the cost of the various advance expenditures. The longer term we have for recovery, the less impact it has on rate changes. San Luis Garbage has a 15 year franchise agreement with the City of San Luis Obispo. Mission Country Disposal has a 15 year franchise agreement with the Cayucos Sanitary District. I would like to meet with you to discuss a 15 year franchise. That will help keep Nipomo CSD's and South County Sanitary Service's costs to a minimum for the long term. We have requested the same length of term from Arroyo Grande, Pismo Beach, Grover Beach, and Oceano CSD.
