#### 00:00:52 C. PRESENTATIONS AND PUBLIC COMMENT

#### C-1) BRAD NEWTON OF SAIC

Presentations re: Fall Groundwater Storage Volumes and Inter-Basin Transfers

Dr. Brad Newton of SAIC (Science Applications International Corporation) presented information concerning the Fall Groundwater Storage Volumes and Inter-Basin Transfers.

The slides presented:

- Groundwater in Storage and the Sub-surface Flow
- The Scope of Work planned for Nipomo Community Services District.
  - Groundwater in Storage (1975 2007)

The Board discussed the information with Dr. Newton. Dr. Newton stated that SAIC sent information to the Technical Group.

The following members of the public spoke:

<u>Kevin Beauchamp</u>, Nipomo resident – stated that in 1992, there seemed to be little correlation between the rainfall and the groundwater storage. He asked if we had salt water intrusion when the water level was at its lowest. Is there flow from somewhere other than rainfall? Why is there a doomsday scenario now when in 1992 the groundwater measurement was at its lowest? Do you measure the flow west to east as well as east to west? If current consumption exceeds rainfall, how long before we have salt water intrusion?

John Brantingham, Nipomo resident – stated that the report was nicely done and mostly easy to understand. He asked if he could get a copy of Table 1 of the report. He stated he is discouraged with the boundaries drawn by DWR. He urged the Board to look at the watershed numbers and see if there is a correlation between the increase in the available water on the Mesa and the large amounts that fall on the hills and head down to this area. He commended the Board for better management of the pumping.

<u>Ingmar Laurenson</u>, Nipomo resident – asked where the closest adjacent study comes from. Are there the same numbers from Santa Maria or Arroyo Grande?

<u>Bill Petrick</u>, NCSD resident – stated that the analysis used in the report should be performed by the three Technical Groups assigned to monitor the health of the Santa Maria basin. He stated that the second report has serious modeling deficiencies and is useless without validation. He stated that Darcy's Law is an experimentally derived equation based on small-scale measurements. The calculations can be 40% less to 320 times greater than those stated in the report. He stated that programs are available from USGS and DWR to do the calculations. The Technical Group should take over the report.

Bruce Buel, General Manager, and Dr. Newton answered some of the *questions* from the public.

Sea-water intrusion – We have not experienced sea water intrusion yet. During that low year (1992) there is no data that tells where the sea water gradient was. In the whole basin view, the judge determined there is the possibility to mine water in dry years and replenish in wet years.

*Little correlation between rainfall and groundwater storage* – Dr. Newton stated that he would repeat what he provided earlier.

Flow measurements from the ocean to the land – That is not being monitored.

When will we be out of water? - It is impossible to predict what will happen. There is no way to know if there will be wet years or dry years ahead.

Copy of Table 1 of the report – There were some copies on the back table. It is available on the web site and in the District office.

Boundaries and why the District is using the Nipomo Mesa Management area and not the entire basin - The boundary lines are largely political and not physical watersheds or groundwater basins. It will be a challenge for the Technical Group to be consistent.

Dr. Newton suggested bringing Mr. Bachman from Oxnard to the District to discuss the very expensive challenges faced by sea water intrusion experienced in Oxnard.

Tim Cleath concept of drawing down the basin and allowing inflow from our adjoining areas - Would that solve our problem? - Absolutely not.

Request that the District seek feedback from the Santa Maria Basin Technical Group and Northern Cities Technical Group - There has been some discussion with the Northern Cities technical representatives and at least one joint meeting is expected. The Santa Maria Basin Technical Group meeting is still pending. Boundary issues must be resolved within the prescribed time frame for the monitoring program. The Technical Group could establish the protocols by which the boundary conditions are rectified between the different management areas.

Criticized use of Darcy's Law in the subsurface flow memorandum - Results needed to be compatible with previous studies by other agencies (DWR, County, etc.) so the number developed has meaning in context with the historical work. Darcy's Law is the standard practice used in these conditions. Alternatively, a finite element difference model like Op Flow could be developed in place of Darcy's Law and equations to solve flow in and out of those little boxes could be highly complicated, complex and non-linear, calibrated with back data and is much higher cost. SAIC does not have that model.

Why are we doing this at all? - The District is concerned with the health of the Nipomo Mesa Groundwater Basin. This data will be shared with the Technical Group. These studies could further the understanding of the Basin. Looking at the Fall readings as well as the Spring, the Board can get a better view of the annual cycles. The Emergency Water Regulations may consider both the Spring and the Fall readings.

Will the Technical Group evaluate this information? - The Technical Group is focused on a well-monitoring program to take to the court for approval. We are ahead of schedule for the court deadline. The Technical Group for the NMMA will use some of the analysis in the monitoring program. Once the monitoring program is approved by the court, the Technical Group will use the monitoring program to develop some analysis that it will report back to the court.

Managing the pumping - It seems to be a matter of rainfall.

Director Eby read a section from a booklet, dated 1931 written by the US Department of the Interior, that stated that the use of Darcy's Law for measurement was appropriate then; and it still is today.

The Board took a break at 11:01 a.m. and reconvened at 11:15 a.m.

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C-2) MIKE DIMILO OF SCIENCE DISCOVERY

Presentation re: Water Conservation Education Outreach Proposal

Mike DiMilo of Science Discovery gave an overview of what his company presents to schools in terms of Water Conservation Education. He presented some slides showing the different types of services his company offers.

Director Vierheilig stated that the Conservation Committee should look into this.

#### TO: Board of Directors, NCSD

I'm writing as a concerned citizen regarding the construction costs of the proposed Miller Park in Nipomo.

According to the assessment report, , there is a recommendation that the NCSD board pledge a portion of the existing property tax reserve (\$1,754,553) to development of the portions of Miller Park that cannot be developed through grants and/or donations.

I'm assuming that if the board is willing to spend any, or all of these tax reserves, on a park for one of our citizens' memorial for her husband, (Peg Miller). . . that we have all the supplemental water that we need for our present and future needs. If that's not the case, I find it unconscionable that you would think it's OK with the tax-paying public, to use our 'water' money in this manner.

I'm sure Jim Miller was an upstanding member of society in Nipomo, and if Ms Miller wants a park to memorialize her husband, I suggest she pay for it. It's unscrupulous to ask the tax-payers to use 'water' money to pay for her husband's memorial park.

According to the assessment report, there will be grants and donations to help pay for the construction of the park, but how do you know how much that will be? Exactly how much WILL come out of the tax reserve? You don't know the answer to that yet. . .and my feeling is that ANY amount is too much. Then, of course, the taxpayers will be forced, through taxes to maintain the park, and NCSD will be required to pay a portion of that as well.

I honestly believe that your focus and our monies need to be used for our water crisis. The poor argument that only a small amount might be spent is not important. Any amount is too much.

Maybe a public meeting might be in order to assess the public opinion on this.
