E. ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

E-3) CONSIDER HOLLOWAY REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF DEADLINE FOR COMPLETION OF WATER AND SEWER WORKS FOR SOUTH OAKGLEN SUBDIVISION

Bruce Buel, General Manager, explained that Tract 2642 is a proposed 18-lot residential subdivision on South Oakglen Avenue that is within the District's Sphere of Influence but outside of the District's current boundary. The applicant, Carl Holloway, has requested a time extension of the outside user agreement, approved February 28, 2007. Mr. Buel and Peter Sevcik, District Engineer, answered questions from the Board.

<u>Carl Holloway</u>, project owner, told the Board that he has spent four to five years putting the plans together and getting them through the County's process.

The following member of the public spoke:

<u>Jesse Hill</u>, NCSD resident, told the Board he has been working with the Holloways on this project. He stated that an agreement with the County stated that the project will not be held up because of the lack of a two-way egress for Cal Fire.

Upon motion by Director Vierheilig and seconded by Director Trotter, the Board agreed to direct staff to prepare an amendment to the outside user agreement, for Board approval at a subsequent meeting, to allow the applicant until March 15, 2011 to begin construction of the water and sewer improvements. Director Trotter stated that if developers can't or do not want to pay impact fee, growth will be slowed or even stopped, which is a fact of life. The District's primary obligation is to its existing water users.

The Board discussed some possible changes in the code. It was suggested to delete #3 but include a portion of it in #2 as "d". Also, the Board suggested defining "large commercial projects". Also, look at the time frame allowed. A rough draft ordinance will be brought back at a subsequent meeting.

Director Trotter stated that the District should continue to expedite the development of the Santa Maria Intertie and slow or even stop the research of desalination because of the high cost of development.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE NIPOMO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT AMENDING AND RESTATING RESOLUTION 2006-968 DECLARING THE DISTRICT'S INTENT TO BE REIMBURSED FOR DISTRICT EXPENDITURES FROM PROCEEDS OF TAX EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS ISSUED BY DISTRICT FOR THE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF THE NIPOMO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT WATERLINE INTERTIE PROJECT WITH THE CITY OF SANTA MARIA

WHEREAS, on or about April 12, 2006, the District adopted Resolution 2006-968 declaring its intent to be reimbursed for Project expenditures (Project as then described) from proceeds of tax-exempt obligations issued by the District; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the adoption of Resolution 2006-968, the District has conducted additional Project studies and field surveys to address projected cost increases and environmental mitigation requirements including:

Preliminary Engineering Memorandum, prepared by Boyle Engineering dated November, 2006; Evaluation of Supplemental Water Alternatives – Technical Memorandum No. 1, prepared by Boyle Engineering dated June 2007; Evaluation of Desalinization as a Source of Supplemental Water – Technical Memorandum No. 2, prepared by Boyle Engineering dated September 28, 2007; Evaluation of Supplemental Water Alternatives – Technical Memorandum No. 3, prepared by Boyle Engineering dated November 30, 2007; California Red-Legged Frog Survey Results, prepared by Padre Associates dated April 12, 2007; Recent Biological Field Survey Results from Padre Associates dated March, 2008; and final Preliminary Engineering; a Draft Environmental Impact Report ("DEIR") titled Nipomo Community Services District Waterline Intertie Draft Environment Impact Report dated November, 2008 ("DEIR"). Said studies and surveys are incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the adoption of Resolution 2006-968 and in addition to the above-referenced restraints and studies, the "Basin Litigation" as described in the DEIR at pages V-30 through V-36 has been substantially resolved; and

WHEREAS, the Project's revisions include reduction in water storage, additional NCSD water distribution system improvements, resolution of water quality issues and phased Project development. The Project is more particularly described in the DEIR and is summarized as follows:

The proposed Project involves connecting to the City of Santa Maria water distribution system and construction of a waterline from Santa Maria to the Nipomo Community Services District water distribution system. The pipeline will be constructed beneath the Santa Maria River by horizontal directional drilling. A pump station(s) and water storage facilities will be constructed to boost the water pressure into the District system and provide operational or emergency water storage as necessary. Several water transmission facilities within the NCSD will be upgraded or replaced. A final element of the proposed Project

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involves the conversion of District water supply wells from chlorination to chloramination treatment in order to provide disinfection that is compatible with the imported water supply; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the economic conditions and environmental mitigation requirements described above, and in order to finance Project construction costs, the District and the County of San Luis Obispo are now considering entering into a Joint Powers Agreement to form a single assessment district that will include other water purveyors who are obligated to purchase Project water as referenced on page V-36 of the DEIR; and

WHEREAS, the District, and/or the above-referenced JPA, intends to finance the Project, or portions of the Project, with proceeds from the sale of obligations, the interest upon which is excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes (the "Obligations"); and

WHEREAS, prior to the issuance of the Obligations the District desires to incur certain expenditures that are in addition to the expenditures referenced in Resolution 2006-968 with respect to the Project from available monies of the District which expenditures are desired to be reimbursed by the District from a portion of the sale of the Obligations; and

WHEREAS, United States Income Tax Regulations section 1.150-2 provides generally that proceeds of tax-exempt debt are not deemed to be expended when such proceeds are used for reimbursement of expenditures made prior to the date of issuance of such debt unless certain procedures are followed, among which is a requirement that (with certain exceptions), prior to the payment of any such expenditure, the issuer declare an intention to be reimbursed such expenditures; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest and for the public benefit that the District amend and restate Resolution 2006-968 declaring its official intent to be reimbursed for the expenditures referenced herein; and

WHEREAS, the District Board considered this item at its regularly scheduled March 11, 2009, Board Meeting.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DECLARED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE NIPOMO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT THAT RESOLUTION 2006-968 IS AMENDED AND RESTATED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. All the Recitals contained in this Resolution are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference and constitute findings in support of this Resolution.
- 2. The District hereby declares its intent to use the proceeds of the Obligations to pay Reimbursement Expenditures incurred prior to the issuance of the Obligations.

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- 3. The reasonably expected maximum principal amount of the Obligations is approximately seventeen million dollars (\$17,000,000.00).
- 4. The limitations described in this Resolution and/or Regulation 1.150-2 do not apply to (a) costs of issuance of the Obligations, (b) an amount not in excess of the lesser of eight hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$850,000.00) or five percent (5%) of the proceeds of the Obligations, or (c) any preliminary expenditures, such as architectural, engineering, surveying, soil testing, and similar costs other than land acquisition, site preparation, and similar costs incident to commencement of construction, not in excess of twenty percent (20%) of the aggregate issue price of the Obligations that finances the Project for which the preliminary expenditures were incurred.
- 5. This Resolution is adopted solely for the purposes of establishing compliance with the requirements of Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations. This Resolution does not bind the District to make any expenditure, incur any indebtedness, or to proceed with the Project.
- 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
