Revise budget to accommodate extra budget costs in setting up Emergency Operations Center [Adopt Resolution]

BACKGROUND

Nipomo Community Services District is required to participate in the Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS). The Board of Directors has authorized the creation and implementation of the NCSD Emergency Operation Center (EOC) in order to respond to local emergencies.

Staff will receive a two day training course this month that was previously approved by the Board of Directors in the amount of \$12,325.

In addition to the training, one of the key elements in responding to a local emergency is the ability to communicate if the telephone land lines and cell phones are out of service. In order to communicate, NCSD needs a two way radio system estimated at \$13,000.00.

FISCAL IMPACT

FY 09-10 Budget included \$20,000 for the completion of the EOC. An additional \$10,000 is requested to complete the project. The additional funds requested will be taken from reserves from the Capital Improvement Budget.

EXTEND TERM OF OUTSIDE-USER AGREEMENT – TRACT 2650

ITEM

Consider request to extend term of Outside-User Agreement for Tract 2650, a sixteen (16) lot subdivision on the corner of Willow Road and Via Concha Road [APPROVE, DENY OR CONTINUE].

BACKGROUND

Tract 2650 is a proposed 16 lot residential subdivision on the corner of Willow Road and Via Concha Road that is within the District's Sphere of Influence but outside of the District's current boundary. The project is being developed by Vintage homes, LLC, the applicant.

The effective date of the Outside User Agreement was March 20, 2008, the date the agreement was recorded, based on the General Manager's determination. The agreement requires the applicant to commence construction of water system improvements by March 20, 2010. The agreement allows the applicant to request a twelve (12) month extension. The applicant submitted the attached request for a two (2) year time extension of the outside user agreement instead of a twelve (12) month extension in August 2009.

The applicant's engineer submitted improvement plans to the District in June 2009 for plan check and the District provided comments in September 2009. The District is currently waiting for a revised submittal from the applicant's engineer. Staff's understanding is that the project is also going through the County's subdivision map and plan review process.

If the Board approves the applicant's request, the applicant would have until March 20, 2012 to begin construction of the water improvements for the project.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff requests your Honorable Board provide staff with direction to approve, deny or continue the applicant's request.

If the Board desires to approve the applicant's request, then staff should be directed to prepare an amendment to the Outside User Agreement, for Board approval at a subsequent meeting, to allow the applicant until March 20, 2012 to begin construction of the water improvements.
