

Community Monitoring Project – Request for Temporary Sampler Location

Dear Mr. LeBrun:

I am requesting permission to locate a temporary particulate matter sampler at the Nipomo CSD Sun Dale well location, 1604 Camino Caballo Nipomo. The sampler will be used in an upcoming community-based particulate matter study from March to May, 2012.

### Project Purpose and General Information:

The San Luis Obispo County Air Pollution Control District (District) is conducting a short-term air quality monitoring project in the Nipomo Mesa neighborhoods during the spring wind season to enhance our understanding of the neighborhood impacts of airborne particulate matter (or PM) blowing off the Oceano Dunes. We are requesting the Nipomo CSD to allow us to temporarily locate a particulate matter sampler and meteorological instrumentation at the Sun Dale well location during the study. The monitor will collect data for three months (March, April & May).

The Community Monitoring Project will include:

- Placement of 14 to 20 air quality monitors in different areas on the Mesa and in Oceano throughout the study.
- Some monitors may be relocated to other areas for more comprehensive coverage during the study
- The initial installation of the monitors will be in February 2012; others will happen later on as monitors are rotated.
- Data collection will occur for three months (March, April and May).
- Samplers will be removed by mid-June.

The site will receive a pre-arranged visit from District staff to determine if the proposed location is suitable for the study. Our primary request is that the CSD allow a safe operational surrounding for the monitor and data integrity, as well as unrestricted APCD access to the equipment during normal business working hours.

### Requirements:

Monitoring sites should provide acceptable distances from wind flow obstructions such as buildings and tall vegetation. The area must provide access to the instruments as required and have electrical power readily available.

### **Equipment concerns:**

- Equipment power draw is less than operating a continuous 50 watt light bulb; at the current PG&E rate the electrical cost for 24 hours will be 24 cents.
- Staff will make certain the equipment installation is safe and will not cause any damage to the
  host's property. The APCD has adequate property insurance coverage in the unlikely event that
  unforeseen property damage occurs.
- Expected staff visits to maintain equipment will occur approximately once every 2 weeks; however, more frequent visits may be necessary in some instances to perform equipment repairs and/or to assure the quality of data.

### Reimbursement:

A small stipend will be provided to cover the costs of electrical power use by the equipment. These funds will be provided once consent is given.

# ESCONDIDO: City borrowing \$76M despite long-term debt concerns

Despite concerns about saddling Escondido's 26,000 water and sewer customers with significant long-term debt, the City Council voted unanimously this week to sell \$76 million in bonds for water and sewer infrastructure upgrades that city officials called crucial.

Mayor Sam Abed questioned whether the expenditures were truly necessary during the council debate Wednesday, reminding his colleagues that struggling families across the city would face sharp rate hikes to cover the new debt.

Partly because of the debt, <u>water rates increased</u> between 12 percent and 14 percent this winter and are scheduled to go up about 10 percent each year through 2015, while sewer rates are scheduled to increase 6 percent per year in 2013, 2014 and 2015.

A 12 percent water hike increases the bill for a typical Escondido family by \$5.84 per month. A 6 percent sewer hike equals about \$3 per month for typical customers.

"I want us to be aware of the magnitude of the decision we are making," Abed told his colleagues. "I don't think we've ever voted to take on \$76 million in debt on this council."

But City Manager Clay Phillips assured Abed and the rest of the council that the upgrades ---- new pipelines, reservoirs and equipment ---- were absolutely necessary.

"The city is risk-averse," said Phillips, adding that the proposed upgrades had been thoroughly analyzed by outside consultants and Utilities Department employees. "We don't go out and issue debt willy-nilly. Quite frankly, we have very limited debt compared to other cities."

<u>Chris McKinney</u>, Escondido's utilities director, said the infrastructure upgrades would be far less expensive than spending an estimated \$400 million to widen outdated pipes that carry partially treated sewage from Escondido to the ocean, which might be required if the upgrades don't happen.

And that approach, which has been described as "building a wider trash can," could also lead to environmental problems and fines for the city.

Councilman Mike Morasco endorsed McKinney's position.

"It's going to be debt one way or the other," he said.

Councilwoman Marie Waldron said the city would probably reap savings from the upgrades equal to their cost, or possibly even larger. She said an example was efforts to upgrade <u>Lake Wohlford Dam</u>, which would allow the city to store more water and possibly lower rates for city residents.

And Councilwoman Olga Diaz noted that only \$58 million of the \$76 million in new debt was for upgrades, because \$18 million will be used to pay off bonds with higher interest rates that the city sold a decade ago.

McKinney said low interest rates make this a great time to sell bonds, estimating that the bonds would be sold in March.

Water debt would increase from \$51 million to \$67 million, with annual debt service climbing from \$3.4 million to \$4.6 million. Sewer debt would increase from \$53 million to \$84 million, with annual debt service on water debt climbing from \$5.2 million to \$6.8 million.

One of the water projects covered by the new debt is moving water distribution staff to a new facility for \$4.2 million. City officials hope to move the employees to city-owned land near the Humane Society where the Charros equestrian group stages rodeos, but that plan has prompted a public outcry.

Other water projects include \$6.5 million for on-site chlorine generation, \$2 million for the Vista Verde Reservoir, \$5 million for the cemetery water line, \$1 million for the Wohlford Dam upgrade and \$1.5 million for the Lindley Reservoir replacement.

Sewer projects include \$7 million for building upgrades at the city's sewer treatment plant on Hale Avenue, \$6 million for an influent pump, \$3.5 million for the west side lift station, \$3.5 million for an easterly main extension, \$2 million for an easterly pump station and \$3.5 million for odor control devices.

Councilman Ed Gallo said he could personally testify to the need for the odor control devices based on time he's spent near the Hale Avenue plant.

"If you've ever been outside that facility, it's not a lot of fun," he said.

The Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) is making curbside supplemental payments pursuant to Public Resources Code §14549.6(a). As an eligible curbside operator, the payment in the amount of \$37,902.11 is being sent to you as the operator of the curbside program for the Nipomo Community Services District.

Your payment represents the curbside supplemental payment program's share of \$15 million to be distributed for CY 2010. The payment is based on the volume of beverage containers reported to CalRecycle by your operation for the period of January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010. CalRecycle derived the rate of \$0.0108817367 per beverage container by dividing the total volume of beverage containers collected by all eligible curbside and neighborhood drop-off programs into the proportionally reduced \$15 million. Statute requires operators of the curbside and neighborhood drop-off programs to expend the payment for activities related to beverage container recycling.

This notice is to inform you of changes in the refund value per segregated pound rates as well as statewide and individual refund value per commingled pound rates for each type of recycling program. Refund value per commingled pound rates are set each year to reflect the percentage of California Redemption Value (CRV) containers in loads of recyclables containing both CRV and non-CRV containers and are the basis for proper payment of CRV for such loads.

New rates for aluminum, glass, plastic, and bimetal beverage containers will be effective March 1, 2012, pursuant to the annual calculation requirement in Public Resources Code Section 14549.5.

Attachment 1 reflects the refund value per pound and containers per pound rates by program type. Table 1 applies only to recycling centers where individual transactions take place. Table 2 applies only to material redeemed through reverse vending machines. Tables 3, 4, and 5 are for curbside programs, certified drop-off or collection programs, and community service programs, respectively.

Attachment 2 is a refund value conversion chart intended only for use by recycling center operators, which reflects the refund values to be paid for consumer transactions. This chart is designed to determine the refund value based on weight received, rounded to the nearest one-tenth pound. This chart is <u>not</u> to be used for curbside, drop-off or collection, and community service program transactions, or materials redeemed through a reverse vending machine.

Curbside, drop-off or collection, and community service programs may exercise their option of conducting an individual commingled rate study to determine rates solely for their program(s).

Attachment 3 specifies the 2012 Individual Commingled Refund Values per Pound and should be used to determine proper payment to applicable curbside, drop-off or collection, and community service programs.

Individual commingled rates are applicable to specific material types (i.e., aluminum, glass, PET plastic, and HDPE plastic).
