SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION AND RECOMMENDED APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2010-14, A RESOLUTION AMONG AND RESTATING THE OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

Background: As the Board is aware, under the Political Reform Act of 1974 adopted by the voters and regulations formulated by the California Fair Political Practices Commission ("FPPC"), all public agencies including community service districts such as Oceano are required to adopt a Conflict of Interest Code. Because elected officials are directly covered by the Act and other FPPC regulations, the Code only applies to other officials whose position is such that they can significantly influence the agency's decisions. The purpose of adopting a Conflict of Interest Code is to alert public officials and members of the public to the types of interests the official has which may create conflicts of interest.

The Political Reform Act requires that a public agency's Conflict of Interest Code be reviewed every two (2) years to determine if it is accurate, or in the alternative if it needs to be amended. Because the current status of the district's code is uncertain, we have chosen to adopt an amended and restated Code.

The FPPC has adopted rules that allow a public agency to adopt the model code published by the Commission at Title 2, Division 6, Section 18730 of the California Code of Regulations. A public agency may incorporate the model code as its Code by referring to Section 18730 in the adopting resolution, and by designating the covered employees and disclosure categories in attached appendices.

Covered employees are those persons holding positions in the District and are Designated Employees within the meaning of the Code. We have identified two (2) Oceano officials who qualify as Designated Employees: the general manager and district legal counsel. You could consider other officials, such as the District Engineer, for inclusion but we do not recommend it. Disclosure categories are those types of interests the Designated Employees have that may influence district decisions and which thus require disclosure.

Resolution 2010-14, attached as Exhibit A, is designed to adopt as the District's Code the model code published by the Commission as of this date and as hereafter modified.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: Consider Resolution 2010-14 and by motion, second and vote approve or disapprove the same.

OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT RESOLUTION NO. 2010-14

A RESOLUTION AMENDING AND RESTATING THE OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

WHEREAS, under the Political Reform Act certain California government agencies ("Covered Agencies"), including community services districts such as the OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT (the "District") are required to adopt a conflict of interest code (the "Code") to alert its public officials and members of the public to the types of interests that may create conflicts of interest; and

WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act requires every Covered Agency to review its Code biennially in even numbered yeas to determine if it is accurate or, alternatively, that the Code must be amended; and

WHEREAS, it has been many years since the District last amended its Code; and

WHEREAS, the California Fair Political Practices Commission (the "Commission") has adopted rules published at 2 California Code of Regulations 18730, et seq., allowing public agencies to adopt a model code by reference to such section, with certain appendices attached thereto to designate the covered officials and categories of interests covered;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by the District's Board as follows:

1. That the recitals set forth above are true, correct and valid.

2. That the District adopts as its Code the model code published by the Commission at 2 California Code of Regulations 18730, et seq. as of this date and as hereafter modified, all as more particularly specified in Exhibit A attached hereto.

3. That those persons holding those positions in the District listed in Appendix 1 of Exhibit A are Designated Employees within the meaning of Code.

4. That the types of interests ("Disclosure Categories") that may be affected by the decision making of the Designated Employees and which require disclosure within the meaning of the Code are listed in Appendix 2 of Exhibit A.

EXHIBIT A

(Regulations of the Fair Political Practices Commission, Title 2, Division 6, California Code of Regulations.)

§ 18730. Provisions of Conflict of Interest Codes.

(a) Incorporation by reference of the terms of this regulation along with the designation of employees and the formulation of disclosure categories in the Appendix referred to below constitute the adoption and promulgation of a conflict of interest code within the meaning of Government Code section 87300 or the amendment of a conflict of interest code within the meaning of Government Code section 87306 if the terms of this regulation are substituted for terms of a conflict of interest code already in effect. A code so amended or adopted and promulgated requires the reporting of reportable items in a manner substantially equivalent to the requirements of article 2 of chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act, Government Code sections 81000, et seq. The requirements of a conflict of interest code are in addition to other requirements of the Political Reform Act, such as the general prohibition against conflicts of interest conflicts of interest.

(b) The terms of a conflict of interest code amended or adopted and promulgated pursuant to this regulation are as follows:

(1) Section 1. Definitions.

The definitions contained in the Political Reform Act of 1974, regulations of the Fair Political Practices Commission (2 Cal. Code of Regs. sections 18110, et seq.), and any amendments to the Act or regulations, are incorporated by reference into this conflict of interest code.

(2) Section 2. Designated Employees.

The persons holding positions listed in the Appendix are designated employees. It has been determined that these persons make or participate in the making of decisions which may foreseeably have a material effect on economic interests.

(3) Section 3. Disclosure Categories.

This code does not establish any disclosure obligation for those designated employees who are also specified in Government Code section 87200 if they are designated in this code in that same capacity or if the geographical jurisdiction of this agency is the same as or is wholly included within the jurisdiction in which those persons must report their economic interests pursuant to article 2 of chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act, Government Code sections 87200, et seq.

In addition, this code does not establish any disclosure obligation for any designated employees who are designated in a conflict of interest code for another agency, if all of the following apply:

(A) The geographical jurisdiction of this agency is the same as or is wholly included within the jurisdiction of the other agency;

(B) The disclosure assigned in the code of the other agency is the same as that required under article 2 of chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act, Government Code section 87200; and

(C) The filing officer is the same for both agencies.1

Such persons are covered by this code for disqualification purposes only. With respect to all other designated employees, the disclosure categories set forth in the Appendix specify which kinds of economic interests are reportable. Such a designated employee shall disclose in his or her statement of economic interests those economic interests he or she has which are of the kind described in the disclosure categories to which he or she is assigned in the Appendix. It has been determined that the economic interests set forth in a designated employee's disclosure categories are the kinds of economic interests which he or she foreseeably can affect materially through the conduct of his or her office.

(4) Section 4. Statements of Economic Interests: Place of Filing.

The code reviewing body shall instruct all designated employees within its code to file statements of economic interests with the agency or with the code reviewing body, as provided by the code reviewing body in the agency's conflict of interest code.2

(5) Section 5. Statements of Economic Interests: Time of Filing.

(A) Initial Statements. All designated employees employed by the agency on the effective date of this code, as originally adopted, promulgated and approved by the code reviewing body, shall file statements within 30 days after the effective date of this code. Thereafter, each person already in a position when it is designated by an amendment to this code shall file an initial statement within 30 days after the effective date of the amendment.

(B) Assuming Office Statements. All persons assuming designated positions after the effective date of this code shall file statements within 30 days after assuming the designated positions, or if subject to State Senate confirmation, 30 days after being nominated or appointed.

(C) Annual Statements. All designated employees shall file statements no later than April

(D) Leaving Office Statements. All persons who leave designated positions shall file statements within 30 days after leaving office.

(5.5) Section 5.5. Statements for Persons Who Resign Prior to Assuming Office.

Any person who resigns within 12 months of initial appointment, or within 30 days of the date of notice provided by the filing officer to file an assuming office statement, is not deemed to

have assumed office or left office, provided he or she did not make or participate in the making of, or use his or her position to influence any decision and did not receive or become entitled to receive any form of payment as a result of his or her appointment. Such persons shall not file either an assuming or leaving office statement.

(A) Any person who resigns a position within 30 days of the date of a notice from the filing officer shall do both of the following:

(1) File a written resignation with the appointing power; and

(2) File a written statement with the filing officer declaring under penalty of perjury that during the period between appointment and resignation he or she did not make, participate in the making, or use the position to influence any decision of the agency or receive, or become entitled to receive, any form of payment by virtue of being appointed to the position.

(6) Section 6. Contents of and Period Covered by Statements of Economic Interests.

(A) Contents of Initial Statements.

Initial statements shall disclose any reportable investments, interests in real property and business positions held on the effective date of the code and income received during the 12 months prior to the effective date of the code.

(B) Contents of Assuming Office Statements.

Assuming office statements shall disclose any reportable investments, interests in real property and business positions held on the date of assuming office or, if subject to State Senate confirmation or appointment, on the date of nomination, and income received during the 12 months prior to the date of assuming office or the date of being appointed or nominated, respectively.

(C) Contents of Annual Statements. Annual statements shall disclose any reportable investments, interests in real property, income and business positions held or received during the previous calendar year provided, however, that the period covered by an employee's first annual statement shall begin on the effective date of the code or the date of assuming office whichever is later, or for a board or commission member subject to Government Code section 87302.6, the day after the closing date of the most recent statement filed by the member pursuant to 2 Cal. Code Regs. section 18754.

(D) Contents of Leaving Office Statements.

Leaving office statements shall disclose reportable investments, interests in real property, income and business positions held or received during the period between the closing date of the last statement filed and the date of leaving office.

(7) Section 7. Manner of Reporting.

Statements of economic interests shall be made on forms prescribed by the Fair Political Practices Commission and supplied by the agency, and shall contain the following information:

(A) Investment and Real Property Disclosure.

When an investment or an interest in real property3 is required to be reported,4 the statement shall contain the following:

1. A statement of the nature of the investment or interest;

2. The name of the business entity in which each investment is held, and a general description of the business activity in which the business entity is engaged;

3. The address or other precise location of the real property;

4. A statement whether the fair market value of the investment or interest in real property equals or exceeds two thousand dollars (\$2,000), exceeds ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), exceeds one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), or exceeds one million dollars (\$1,000,000).

(B) Personal Income Disclosure. When personal income is required to be reported,5 the statement shall contain:

 The name and address of each source of income aggregating five hundred dollars (\$500) or more in value, or fifty dollars (\$50) or more in value if the income was a gift, and a general description of the business activity, if any, of each source;

2. A statement whether the aggregate value of income from each source, or in the case of a loan, the highest amount owed to each source, was one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or less, greater than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), greater than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or greater than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000);

3. A description of the consideration, if any, for which the income was received;

4. In the case of a gift, the name, address and business activity of the donor and any intermediary through which the gift was made; a description of the gift; the amount or value of the gift; and the date on which the gift was received;

5. In the case of a loan, the annual interest rate and the security, if any, given for the loan and the term of the loan.

(C) Business Entity Income Disclosure. When income of a business entity, including income of a sole proprietorship, is required to be reported,6 the statement shall contain:

 The name, address, and a general description of the business activity of the business entity; 2. The name of every person from whom the business entity received payments if the filer's pro rata share of gross receipts from such person was equal to or greater than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

(D) Business Position Disclosure. When business positions are required to be reported, a designated employee shall list the name and address of each business entity in which he or she is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or in which he or she holds any position of management, a description of the business activity in which the business entity is engaged, and the designated employee's position with the business entity.

(E) Acquisition or Disposal During Reporting Period. In the case of an annual or leaving office statement, if an investment or an interest in real property was partially or wholly acquired or disposed of during the period covered by the statement, the statement shall contain the date of acquisition or disposal.

(8) Section 8. Prohibition on Receipt of Honoraria.

(A) No member of a state board or commission, and no designated employee of a state or local government agency, shall accept any honorarium from any source, if the member or employee would be required to report the receipt of income or gifts from that source on his or her statement of economic interests. This section shall not apply to any part-time member of the governing board of any public institution of higher education, unless the member is also an elected official.

Subdivisions (a), (b), and (c) of Government Code Section 89501 shall apply to the prohibitions in this section.

This section shall not limit or prohibit payments, advances, or reimbursements for travel and related lodging and subsistence authorized by Government Code section 89506. (8.1) Section 8.1. Prohibition on Receipt of Gifts in Excess of \$420.

(A) No member of a state board or commission, and no designated employee of a state or local government agency, shall accept gifts with a total value of more than \$420 in a calendar year from any single source, if the member or employee would be required to report the receipt of income or gifts from that source on his or her statement of economic interests. This section shall not apply to any part-time member of the governing board of any public institution of higher education, unless the member is also an elected official.

Subdivisions (e), (f), and (g) of Government Code section 89503 shall apply to the prohibitions in this section.

(8.2) Section 8.2. Loans to Public Officials.

(A) No elected officer of a state or local government agency shall, from the date of his or her election to office through the date that he or she vacates office, receive a personal loan from any officer, employee, member, or consultant of the state or local government agency in which the elected officer holds office or over which the elected officer's agency has direction and control.

(B) No public official who is exempt from the state civil service system pursuant to subdivisions (c), (d), (e), (f), and (g) of Section 4 of Article VII of the Constitution shall, while he or she holds office, receive a personal loan from any officer, employee, member, or consultant of the state or local government agency in which the public official holds office or over which the public official's agency has direction and control. This subdivision shall not apply to loans made to a public official whose duties are solely secretarial, clerical, or manual.

(C) No elected officer of a state or local government agency shall, from the date of his or her election to office through the date that he or she vacates office, receive a personal loan from any person who has a contract with the state or local government agency to which that elected officer has been elected or over which that elected officer's agency has direction and control. This subdivision shall not apply to loans made by banks or other financial institutions or to any indebtedness created as part of a retail installment or credit card transaction, if the loan is made or the indebtedness created in the lender's regular course of business on terms available to members of the public without regard to the elected officer's official status.

(D) No public official who is exempt from the state civil service system pursuant to subdivisions (c), (d), (e), (f), and (g) of Section 4 of Article VII of the Constitution shall, while he or she holds office, receive a personal loan from any person who has a contract with the state or local government agency to which that elected officer has been elected or over which that elected officer's agency has direction and control. This subdivision shall not apply to loans made by banks or other financial institutions or to any indebtedness created as part of a retail installment or credit card transaction, if the loan is made or the indebtedness created in the lender's regular course of business on terms available to members of the public without regard to the elected officer's official status. This subdivision shall not apply to loans made to a public official whose duties are solely secretarial, clerical, or manual.

(E) This section shall not apply to the following:

1. Loans made to the campaign committee of an elected officer or candidate for elective office.

2. Loans made by a public official's spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, parent-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, nephew, niece, aunt, uncle, or first cousin, or the spouse of any such persons, provided that the person making the loan is not acting as an agent or intermediary for any person not otherwise exempted under this section. Loans from a person which, in the aggregate, do not exceed five hundred dollars (\$500) at any given time.

4. Loans made, or offered in writing, before January 1, 1998.

(8.3) Section 8.3. Loan Terms.

(A) Except as set forth in subdivision (B), no elected officer of a state or local government agency shall, from the date of his or her election to office through the date he or she vacates office, receive a personal loan of five hundred dollars (\$500) or more, except when the loan is in writing and clearly states the terms of the loan, including the parties to the loan agreement, date of the loan, amount of the loan, term of the loan, date or dates when payments shall be due on the loan and the amount of the payments, and the rate of interest paid on the loan.

(B) This section shall not apply to the following types of loans:

1. Loans made to the campaign committee of the elected officer.

2. Loans made to the elected officer by his or her spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, parent-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, nephew, niece, aunt, uncle, or first cousin, or the spouse of any such person, provided that the person making the loan is not acting as an agent or intermediary for any person not otherwise exempted under this section.

3. Loans made, or offered in writing, before January 1, 1998.

(C) Nothing in this section shall exempt any person from any other provision of Title 9 of the Government Code.

(8.4) Section 8.4. Personal Loans.

(A) Except as set forth in subdivision (B), a personal loan received by any designated employee shall become a gift to the designated employee for the purposes of this section in the following circumstances:

1. If the loan has a defined date or dates for repayment, when the statute of limitations for filing an action for default has expired.

2. If the loan has no defined date or dates for repayment, when one year has elapsed from the later of the following:

a. The date the loan was made.

b. The date the last payment of one hundred dollars (\$100) or more was made on the loan.

c. The date upon which the debtor has made payments on the loan aggregating to less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) during the previous 12 months.

(B) This section shall not apply to the following types of loans:

 A loan made to the campaign committee of an elected officer or a candidate for elective office.

2. A loan that would otherwise not be a gift as defined in this title.

3. A loan that would otherwise be a gift as set forth under subdivision (A), but on which the creditor has taken reasonable action to collect the balance due.

4. A loan that would otherwise be a gift as set forth under subdivision (A), but on which the creditor, based on reasonable business considerations, has not undertaken collection action. Except in a criminal action, a creditor who claims that a loan is not a gift on the basis of this paragraph has the burden of proving that the decision for not taking collection action was based on reasonable business considerations. A loan made to a debtor who has filed for bankruptcy and the loan is ultimately discharged in bankruptcy.

(C) Nothing in this section shall exempt any person from any other provisions of Title 9 of the Government Code.

(9) Section 9. Disqualification.

No designated employee shall make, participate in making, or in any way attempt to use his or her official position to influence the making of any governmental decision which he or she knows or has reason to know will have a reasonably foreseeable material financial effect, distinguishable from its effect on the public generally, on the official or a member of his or her immediate family or on:

(A) Any business entity in which the designated employee has a direct or indirect investment worth two thousand dollars (\$2,000) or more;

(B) Any real property in which the designated employee has a direct or indirect interest worth two thousand dollars (\$2,000) or more;

(C) Any source of income, other than gifts and other than loans by a commercial lending institution in the regular course of business on terms available to the public without regard to official status, aggregating five hundred dollars (\$500) or more in value provided to, received by or promised to the designated employee within 12 months prior to the time when the decision is made;

(D) Any business entity in which the designated employee is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or holds any position of management; or

(E) Any donor of, or any intermediary or agent for a donor of, a gift or gifts aggregating \$420 or more provided to, received by, or promised to the designated employee within 12 months prior to the time when the decision is made.

(9.3) Section 9.3. Legally Required Participation.

No designated employee shall be prevented from making or participating in the making of any decision to the extent his or her participation is legally required for the decision to be made. The fact that the vote of a designated employee who is on a voting body is needed to break a tie does not make his or her participation legally required for purposes of this section.

(9.5) Section 9.5. Disqualification of State Officers and Employees.

In addition to the general disqualification provisions of section 9, no state administrative official shall make, participate in making, or use his or her official position to influence any governmental decision directly relating to any contract where the state administrative official knows or has reason to know that any party to the contract is a person with whom the state administrative official, or any member of his or her immediate family has, within 12 months prior to the time when the official action is to be taken:

(A) Engaged in a business transaction or transactions on terms not available to members of the public, regarding any investment or interest in real property; or

(B) Engaged in a business transaction or transactions on terms not available to members of the public regarding the rendering of goods or services totaling in value one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more.

(10) Section 10. Disclosure of Disqualifying Interest.

When a designated employee determines that he or she should not make a governmental decision because he or she has a disqualifying interest in it, the determination not to act may be accompanied by disclosure of the disqualifying interest.

(11) Section 11. Assistance of the Commission and Counsel.

Any designated employee who is unsure of his or her duties under this code may request assistance from the Fair Political Practices Commission pursuant to Government Code section 83114 and 2 Cal. Code Regs. sections 18329 and 18329.5 or from the attorney for his or her agency, provided that nothing in this section requires the attorney for the agency to issue any formal or informal opinion.

(12) Section 12. Violations.

This code has the force and effect of law. Designated employees violating any provision of this code are subject to the administrative, criminal and civil sanctions provided in the Political Reform Act, Government Code sections 81000-91014. In addition, a decision in relation to which a violation of the disqualification provisions of this code or of Government Code section 87100 or 87450 has occurred may be set aside as void pursuant to Government Code section 91003.

1Designated employees who are required to file statements of economic interests under any other agency's conflict of interest code, or under article 2 for a different jurisdiction, may expand their statement of economic interests to cover reportable interests in both jurisdictions, and file copies of this expanded statement with both entities in lieu of filing separate and distinct statements, provided that each copy of such expanded statement filed in place of an original is signed and verified by the designated employee as if it were an original. See Government Code section 81004.

2See Government Code section 81010 and 2 Cal. Code of Regs. section 18115 for the duties of filing officers and persons in agencies who make and retain copies of statements and forward the originals to the filing officer.

3For the purpose of disclosure only (not disqualification), an interest in real property does not include the principal residence of the filer.

4Investments and interests in real property which have a fair market value of less than \$2,000 are not investments and interests in real property within the meaning of the Political Reform Act. However, investments or interests in real property of an individual include those held by the individual's spouse and dependent children as well as a pro rata share of any investment or interest in real property of any business entity or trust in which the individual, spouse and dependent children own, in the aggregate, a direct, indirect or beneficial interest of 10 percent or greater.

5A designated employee's income includes his or her community property interest in the income of his or her spouse but does not include salary or reimbursement for expenses received from a state, local or federal government agency.

6Income of a business entity is reportable if the direct, indirect or beneficial interest of the filer and the filer's spouse in the business entity aggregates a 10 percent or greater interest. In addition, the disclosure of persons who are clients or customers of a business entity is required only if the clients or customers are within one of the disclosure categories of the filer. Note: Authority cited: Section 83112, Government Code. Reference: Sections 87103(e), 87300-87302, 89501, 89502 and 89503, Government Code.

SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION AND RECOMMENDED APPROVAL OF FIRE TRUCK/AERIAL APPARATUS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT (the "AGREEMENT") BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF GROVER BEACH, THE CITY OF ARROYO GRANDE AND THE OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT

Background: The City of Arroyo Grande was recently successful in obtaining a grant in the amount \$815,625.00 from the Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program to purchase a 100" Aerial Platform fire apparatus, at a total cost of \$925,607.00, for use by the Five Cities Fire Authority. Arroyo Grande has made arrangements for financing the difference between the total cost and the grant (\$150,764.00) in annual payments of \$38,478.00 over a five (5) year period, which would require Arroyo Grande, Grover Beach, and Oceano to each contribute a proportionate share to that financing. The Agreement calls for Oceano to provide 15% of the financing, which is \$5,772.00 a year.

The Agreement provides that until such time as the financing payments have been retired, ownership of the fire apparatus shall remain with the City of Arroyo Grande and ownership and control shall be governed by the terms of the Joint Powers Agreement of the Five Cities Fire Authority. When the financing is successfully retired, ownership of the fire apparatus will be transferred to the Five Cities Fire Authority.

The Agreement, attached as Exhibit A, is designed for the purpose of memorializing the terms and conditions of the fire apparatus purchase.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: Consider the Agreement and by motion, second and vote approve or disapprove the same.

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EXHIBIT "A"

FIRE TRUCK/AERIAL APPARATUS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

This Fire Truck/Aerial Apparatus Cooperative Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the City of Grover Beach, a municipal corporation ("Grover Beach"), the City of Arroyo Grande, a municipal corporation ("Arroyo Grande"), and the Oceano Community Services District, a California special district ("OCSD"), collectively or individually referred to as "Parties" or "Party".

RECITALS

WHEREAS, each of the Parties previously operated a fire department with finite fire service resources. Based upon their recognition of the benefits of combining their respective fire service resources, in July 2004 Arroyo Grande and Grover Beach entered into an agreement to provide joint administration of fire services for both jurisdictions. In March 2008 the agreement was amended to include OCSD. Subsequently, Arroyo Grande, Grover Beach and OCSD have entered into a Joint Powers Agreement pursuant to which a separate agency, the Five Cities Fire Authority, has been created to combine their respective fire service providers into one provider; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Arroyo Grande recently was successful in securing grant funding from the Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program to purchase a 100" Aerial Platform fire apparatus (hereinafter called the "Grant""); and,

WHEREAS, Arroyo Grande has determined that the Fire Apparatus to be purchased will be a Quint 100' aerial platform fire apparatus from Pierce Manufacturing, Inc. (the "Fire Apparatus"), and that the acquisition of the Fire Apparatus will be on the basis of a lease purchase at a cost of \$851,543, plus \$74,065 sales tax, making the total cost of the Fire Apparatus \$925,607; and, WHEREAS, although under the proposed Joint Powers Agreement major pieces of fire apparatus are the property of the Five Cities Fire Authority, it is understood that based upon the Grant funding the Fire Apparatus must remain under the ownership of the City of Arroyo Grande until any financing that is arranged for its acquisition has been retired; and,

WHEREAS, the Grant is in the amount of \$815,625 and the parties are in agreement that the funds for matching the Grant and otherwise required for the balance of the cost to acquire the Fire Apparatus shall be shared, as further provided in this Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, after applying the proceeds of the Grant toward the lease agreement, there will be a balance of \$150,764 to finance in annual payments of \$38,478 over a five year period; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement will facilitate the forgoing and will be to the mutual interest and advantage of all Parties;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein made, the Parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Purpose</u>. This Agreement when executed by the Parties hereto shall provide for the ownership, operation and sharing of the costs related to the Fire Apparatus.

2. <u>Cost Allocation.</u> The following cost allocation ("Cost Allocation"), which has been developed based upon an analysis of a combination of population, historical utilization of the ladder truck being replaced by the Fire Apparatus, and the number of structures in each jurisdiction that would potentially require use of the Fire Apparatus during response to a fire incident, is the appropriate method for sharing the cost of the Fire Apparatus.

Arroyo Grande: 55%

Grover Beach: 30% OCSD: 15%

3. <u>Financing.</u> The City of Arroyo Grande shall be responsible for executing any and all documents related to the Grant, as well as arranging for the purchase and financing of the Fire Apparatus. It is understood that the financing will be in the form of a 5-year lease purchase agreement with annual payments in the amount of \$38,478.35. Based upon the Cost Allocation in paragraph 2, each Parties' allocation of the annual payment ("Financing Allocation") shall be:

Arroyo Grande (55%): \$21,163.00 Grover Beach (30%): \$11,544.00 OCSD (15%): \$5,772.00

4. <u>Cost Reimbursement</u>. The Parties shall transmit their respective portion of Financing Allocation within 30 days of receipt of invoices sent by Arroyo Grande. In addition, the Parties' agree that any ongoing maintenance and operational costs incurred by Arroyo Grande will also be shared in the same proportion as the Cost Allocation and subject to payment by the parties upon being invoiced by Arroyo Grande. Maintenance and operational costs shall include any costs for insuring the Fire Apparatus incurred by Arroyo Grande.

5. <u>Ownership and Operation of Fire Apparatus.</u> Until such time as the financing has been retired, ownership of the Fire Apparatus shall remain with the City of Arroyo Grande. Thereafter Arroyo Grande shall transfer ownership to the Five Cities Fire Authority. Anything in this Agreement to the contrary notwithstanding, control of the Fire Apparatus shall be subject to the terms and conditions of the Joint Powers Agreement relating to major pieces of apparatus. The Fire Apparatus shall include standardized Five Cities Fire Authority identification and operation shall be under the control of the Five Cities Fire Authority.

A separate agreement for operation of the Fire Apparatus by the Five Cities Fire Authority will also be entered into between Arroyo Grande and the Authority to provide for the day to day operation of the Fire Apparatus until retirement of the financing, as provided in this Section 5. Pursuant to the agreement as described in this Section 5, the operation of the Fire Apparatus shall be governed by the terms of the Joint Powers Agreement until it is transferred to the Five Cities Fire Authority as provided herein.

6. <u>Term of this Agreement</u>. The term of this Agreement shall commence immediately upon execution by all Parties and shall terminate after ownership of the Fire Apparatus has been transferred to the Five Cities Fire Authority. In the event Arroyo Grande terminates its membership in the Five Cities Fire Authority prior to the retirement of the financing and transfer of ownership of the Fire Apparatus to the Authority, the Parties agree that financial arrangements will be made in a manner that insures that Fire Apparatus will still be made available for use by the Five Cities Joint Authority, or if the Authority is disbanded, to the other Parties to this Agreement. The Parties agree to bargain in good faith to create a new agreement providing for such financing and use.

7. <u>Non-assignability</u>. This Agreement may not be assigned by any Party without first obtaining the express written consent of the remaining non-assigning Parties.

8. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice or communication required under this Agreement to be delivered to, served upon, or given to any Party by any other Party to this Agreement must be in writing and may be given either by (i) personal service, (ii) delivery by a reputable document delivery service, such as but not limited to, Federal Express, which provides a receipt showing date and time of delivery, or (iii) mailing in the United States Mail, certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, addressed to the address of the party as set forth below or at any other address as that party may later designate by notice:

9. <u>Mutual Indemnification</u>. The Parties agree to indemnify, defend and hold all other Parties harmless from all liability for damage to persons or property arising out of or resulting from the acts or omissions of the indemnifying Party in connection with any subject matter covered under this Agreement.

10. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. Grover Beach, Arroyo Grande and OCSD agree that this Agreement constitutes the sole and only Agreement between them regarding the financing of the Fire Apparatus and correctly sets forth their obligations and duties with respect to each other.

11. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may be amended only by a written consent of the Parties to the Agreement.

No Interpretation Against Drafting. This Agreement has been negotiated at arm's 12. length between the Parties hereto. Accordingly, any rule or law (including California Civil Code § 1635 et seq.) or legal decisions that would require interpretation, or any ambiguities in the Agreement against the Party that has drafted the applicable provision, is not applicable and is waived. The provisions of the Agreement shall be interpreted in a reasonable manner to affect the purpose and intent of the Parties.

13. Counterparts. The Parties hereto agree that there shall be three originals of this Agreement which shall be identical in all respects, including form and substance. The Parties may execute this Agreement in three or more counterparts, which shall, in the aggregate, be deemed an original, but all of which, together, shall constitute one and the same instrument.

14. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of California.
