NCSD board reviews water

A new draft study of groundwater supplies in the Nipomo Mesa Management Area reveals that each year the community draws more from wells than is being replenished from rainfall confirming the need for supplemental water.

However, there is no immediate shortage problem, and one can be avoided if a stable source of new water is secured in the near future, said Bruce Buel, general manager of the Nipomo Community Services District (NCSD).

"We have a chronic problem here, but this is not a crisis," Buel said. "We don't need to overreact right now."

The NCSD board reviewed the study Wednesday in an effort to update its allocation policy, which provides guidelines for available water and estimates quantities that residential developments will use on an annual basis.

The study, prepared by Science Applications International Corp., an engineering and environmental firm in Santa Barbara, said that as of April, there were 121,000 acre-feet of water above sea level in the Nipomo Mesa Management Area.

That figure is down from 124,000 acre-feet recorded in April 2000.

However, the decline of 500 acre-feet per year is less than the 800 that was predicated in a study a few years ago, Buel said. This likely can be attributed to two years of heavy rainfall, he added.

While the board lauded the initial study and said it is a step in the right direction, directors Ed Eby and Mike Winn said they'd like to see figures that distinguish between available groundwater and usable groundwater, which would provide a more accurate picture of the community's water situation.

"There's water in this cork, but it would be awfully hard to get it out," Eby said, holding up his drink coaster.

"The key is knowing the dependable yield."

Eby also said he would like to incorporate into the calculations all of the outstanding projects that have already been allocated water, but have yet to cash in on those promises.

Wednesday's discussion follows the district's decision last month to delay a 38-unit subdivision on Blume Street until the allocation policy was updated based on water supply instead of growth in the community.

The NCSD board is expected to review a finalized report on groundwater storage at its next meeting, at 9 a.m. Oct. 25 in the district's building, 148 S. Wilson St.

Also at that time, the directors will review the Blume project again and have an opportunity to decide whether there is groundwater available to continue allocating more to new developments.
